TWO DAYS FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
ON NEP and Teaching Strategies (July 9th & 10th, 2024)

- **Closing Session:**

- The final session, led by Dr. Sudhir Atwadkar, titled "Creating a Culture of Excellence in Bearys," was an activity-based session designed to cultivate leadership qualities in students. Dr. Atwadkar highlighted the importance of fostering good communication, motivation, initiative, reliability, teamwork, patience, and adaptability in students. He also provided strategies for developing creativity in young minds.
