Participating in conferences and publishing research papers often involves registration fees and travel expenses, which may not always be affordable for students.

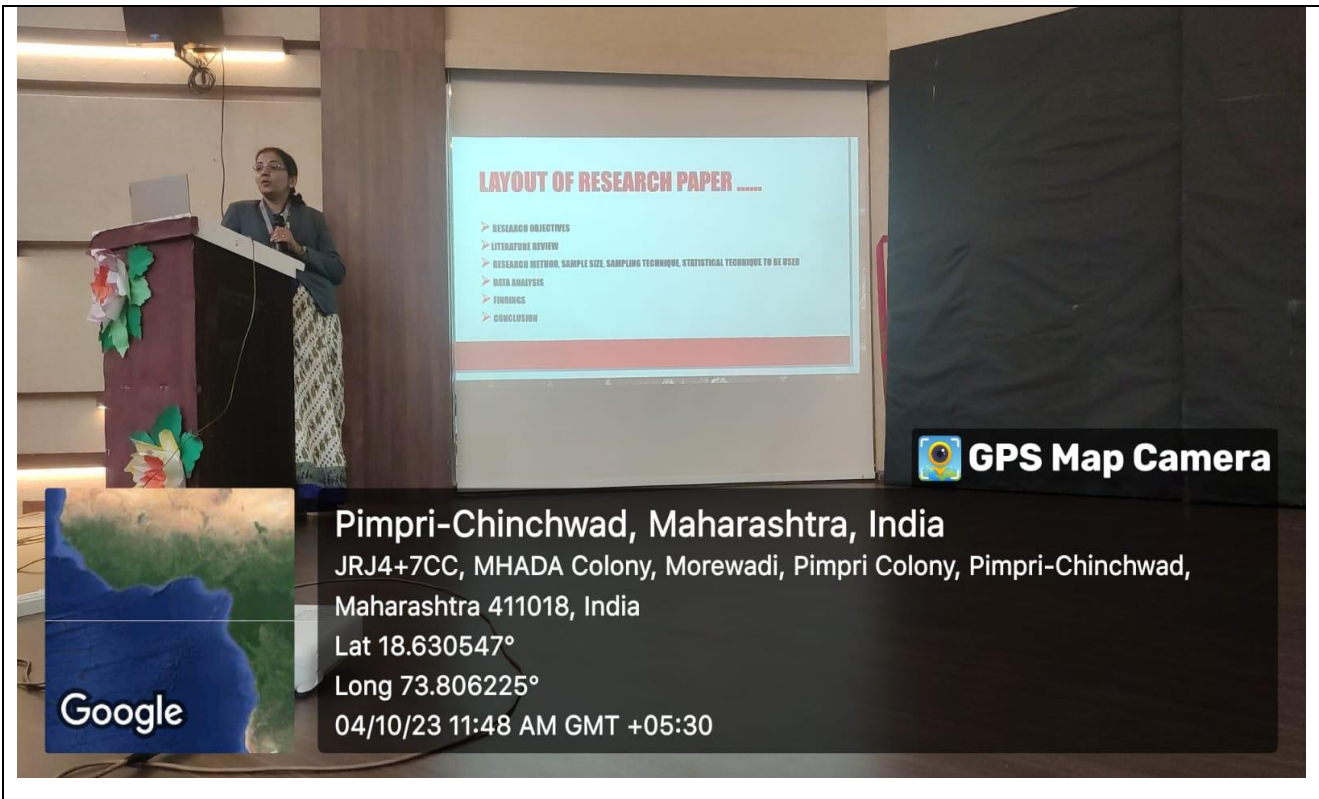
2. Fear of Rejection:
